Nội dung cuốn sách được biên soạn theo từng đơn vị bài học của chương trình chuẩn sách giáo khoa Tiếng Anh 12 do Bộ Giáo dục và Đào tạo ban hành, bao gồm 16 đơn vị bài học, 6 bài ôn tập củng cố và hai bài kiểm tra học kì. Mỗi đơn vị bài học được soạn thành hai bài kiểm tra, mỗi bài gồm 50 câu trắc nghiệm, học sinh có thể làm trong thời gian 45 phút.
